Editor of Blue Ridge Herald:

Your editorial of last week entitled "When Does A School Bus Stop" is very constructive and commendable.

My own reaction is as follows:

We school authorities very earnestly desire to make our transportation of school children safe both for the children and all drivers or travellers affected by us.

School busses ought to give some kind of signal before beginning to slow down for a stop. This has been considered for sometime. By next fall all of our busses will have the switches controlling the traffic signal lights located in contact with the manual door control rather than in the hinge of the door. This will enable school bus drivers to give advance notice of each stop by pulling the door control handle slightly and without opening the door even slightly.

We expect to instruct each driver next fall to turn on the red blinker light just before the bus begins to slow down as it approaches a stop.

On the other hand, all drivers of motor vehicles who see a school bus nearby on a highway would be well-advised to proceed at a speed less than 50 miles per hour. They would also be well-advised to give close attention to section 46-229 of the Motor Vehicle Laws of Virginia which requires that "the driver of any motor truck or bus shall not follow another motor truck or bus within 200 feet when upon any highway outside of cities and towns."
