### Text

TO The Honorable School Trustees And Supreintendent (sic) Of Schools, Greeting.

It has been brought to our attention by various reports and rumors that no teacher was to be appointed to the Carter School for the session of 1927-28.

Not to have a teacher for this school would be a great injustice and injury to the deserving children of this isolated community. No other schools are near and the almost impassable mud roads of winter would make it impossible for most, if not all, of our children to attend school else where.

Therefore, we, the following tax payers and Patrons of Carters School (with the number of children as indicated) most vigorously and strongly protest that failure to appoint a teacher for our school would be an unnecessary discrimination and injustice to us and our children.

We respectfully petition and request that you appoint as teacher of the Carters School, Mrs. Mary E. Hemsley, a teacher of high standing and ability. With Mrs. Hemsley's force of character, energy and enthusiasm directing our school the daily attendence (sic) will be much better than heretofore and pupils and patrons will have a renewed and greater appreciation for educational training.
